

Clerk's report following 28th November 2016 meeting

Follow up to matters arising:

YLCA have advised that they have received a response from Peter Featherstone, Planning and Development Manager at Richmondshire District Council who has confirmed a blanket permission to all parish and town councils in the district to copy planning applications in accordance with the principles laid out in NALC's Legal Topic Note 60.

YLCA has received notification from the National Association of Local Councils advising that council tax referendum principles have not been extended to local councils (parish, town, village, neighbourhood and community councils) in 2017/18. The secretary of state for communities and local government has just announced:

"[Town and parish councils] play an important role in our civic life. We have decided that we will defer our proposals this year, while keeping the level of precepts set by town and parish councils under close review. I expect all town and parish councils to clearly demonstrate restraint when setting increases that are not a direct result of taking on additional responsibilities. I am also actively considering with the sector ways to make excessive increases more transparent to local taxpayers."

The Precept application has been submitted to Richmondshire District Council.

David Ward has completed the work to the bench at the bottom of Runs Bank.

Highways have installed a Footpath sign on Mill Lane.

The Speed awareness signs have been erected.

Community Right to Bid - Successful Nomination for the Cross Keys Inn confirmation has been received.

The Land Registration Application for the Memorial Hall and Playing Field has been submitted and an acknowledgement has been received.

A letter to Scott Wright Solicitors has been sent requesting an update to the position of the landowners they represent re the Bellerby-Leyburn Footpath. Their response to Cllr Hutchinson has been circulated to all the Parish Councillors and an acknowledgment has been sent in return. This item has been included in the agenda for discussion.

The loose sign on the Leyburn edge of the village has been reported to highways.

Received from NYCC: Urban grass cutting payments 2017/18

Our current records indicate that the County Council funds your Parish Council to carry out the urban visibility grass cutting in your parish.

We recognise that parishes across our region are facing significant financial challenges. To this end I am pleased to confirm that the amount of money given to those parishes that organise their own urban grass

cutting will rise from 6 pence per m2 to 7 pence per m2. This increase will apply to the 2017/18 financial year.

We have been able to fund this increase due to improved efficiencies across the whole of the highway grass cutting service. The funding for grass cutting of urban highway visibility splays to your Parish Council for 2017/18 will be £44.78.

We therefore need to confirm whether your Parish Council wishes to continue grass cutting in 2017/18 and would ask that you confirm which of the following options you wish to adopt:

Option PC: If your parish wishes to carry out urban highway visibility grass cutting in 2017/18: We will continue to fund five cuts per year of the visibility grass. The area of grass that we will fund has not changed from 2015/16. Details can be found at www.northyorks.gov.uk/verges.

Council to decide if wish to continue with the grass cutting.

Received from YLCA: MEMBERSHIP OF YLCA, 2017/2018

You will be aware that the subscription is divided into two elements; part to support the YLCA locally and part to subscribe the Council to the National Association of Local Councils (NALC). The YLCA subscription uses a banding system based on electorate and the NALC subscription is based on a pence per elector. YLCA is only a collection agency for the latter fee, ie that exact element of the subscription is passed to NALC; YLCA does not retain any of this.

Please find below the charging band for the YLCA element of the fee. Use this with the 6.73 pence per elector fee for NALC multiplied by the number of electors for your parish (at 3 December) and you will be able to calculate the fee for your Council for the next financial year.

Elector band relevant to Bellerby	YLCA Fee
150 - 349	105

Bellerby currently has 313 electors which by my calculation gives a membership fee of £126. Council to decide if wish to continue membership.

POLICE are urging rural residents to 'Call it in' and help target crime in the countryside.

North Yorkshire Police's Rural Taskforce said local communities were their 'eyes and ears'— allowing officers to clamp down on crime wherever it occurs. The force has launched a 'Call it in' campaign, asking residents to note down and report any suspicious activity, particularly in remote or isolated areas. The campaign will feature in prominent adverts in local newspapers, on beer mats in more than 50 rural and at livestock auction marts. Social media will be used to spread the word too, using the hashtag #callitin.

Inspector Grainger states "Please report anything suspicious to the police using the 101 phone number. Even if it doesn't need an immediate response, every piece of information helps us build up a picture and could prove vital in bringing criminals to justice."

GPs urge patients with flu-like symptoms to think about self-care

GP surgeries across Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby areas have seen a rise in patients with flu-like symptoms and are urging these patients to look at self-care options.

Winter can generally bring more seasonable illnesses such as the flu-virus. November saw an increase in patients visiting their GP with flu-like symptoms which can potentially be managed at home or by visiting a local pharmacist.

Changes to Waste and Recycling Collection Rounds

I am writing to all Parish Clerks concerning the above change for households within Richmondshire. As from 16 January 2017, most households will see their waste and recycling collection day change. This is due to the Council changing working practices within the collection teams in order to reduce the number of refuse collection vehicles needed. A communications plan is currently being implemented to ensure that all our residents are aware of the changes. Communications include:

- Press releases have and will continue to be issued.
- Area Partnerships are being updated.

- We have placed adverts in local media and on the side of our refuse vehicles

Superfast Broadband is planned for parts of your Parish

NYCC and BT are planning to upgrade most of the properties in Bellerby to superfast broadband by the end of summer 2017. Whilst this depends on positive results from a detailed physical survey, we are confident that these results will show that the work can be completed within the budget.
