## STREAM transfer to Data North Yorkshire

be able to access the most frequently used information from **STREAM** together with a wide range of new information including interactive articles which help to give a boarder understanding of datasets such as the Indices of Deprivation.

## Population estimates for local authorities updated

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) has released its 2015 mid-year population estimates for local authority areas. The latest figures include an age breakdown and total population at county and at district level. They can be accessed at <http://hub.datanorthyorkshire.org/dataset/population-estimates/>

Look out for 2015 figures for small areas being added to the site in the autumn.

## Health Profiles 2016

Public Health England has released updated health profiles for local authority areas. The profiles bring together a wide range of statistics including lifestyle information on children and adults, life expectancy and mortality figures, education and deprivation data to provide a comprehensive overview of the county and districts. ## Yorkshire Dales National Park grows by 24%

On 1 August 2016 the area covered by the Yorkshire Dales National Park increased to include additional parts of northern England. The boundary change means that the National Park now takes in additional parts of Cumbria together with a small part of Lancashire.

It will take some time for official statistics to catch up with the boundary change so for the now the information in Data North Yorkshire relates to the national park before the expansion.

## Fewer people killed on North Yorkshire's roads

The number of people killed on North Yorkshire's roads is the joint lowest since modern records began, according to latest figures.



The information comes from a new report on road casualties in the county during 2015 which has been released by the NYCC Road Safety team. The report, which presents statistics on personal-injury collisions and casualties on public roads which became known to the police, can be accessed by searching for '[road safety](#)' in the datasets on [Data North Yorkshire](#).
