The results of the North Yorkshire County Council summer 2017 Citizens' Panel

survey have been released. The survey of around 2,000 North Yorkshire residents has provided valuable feedback on the opinions of residents regarding community safety, councillors' remuneration and on sport and intentional physical activity, with questions which were asked on behalf of North Yorkshire Sport.

Third Sector Trends in Yorkshire and the Humber

A report on Third Sector organisations, funded by Joseph Rowntree Foundation



and based on a survey of over 1,000 charities and people who regularly volunteer has found that 341,700 people regularly volunteer in Yorkshire – giving over 24m hours of work each year. If paid average wages, it would cost £297m to replace them. The report finds that the Third Sector was more buoyant in 2016 than at the time of the previous survey, carried out in 2013.

Personal well-being estimates

The latest life satisfaction rates at local authority level have been released by the Office for National Statistics. As in previous years North Yorkshire is rated above the national average for the Life Satisfaction, Worthwhile and Happy measures and below the national average for Anxiety in 2016-17.

Craven is rated the best local authority area nationally for Life Satisfaction, with Richmondshire just slightly behind in fourth place. Craven is also rated as the best local authority area nationally for the Happy measure. In terms of feeling Worthwhile Richmondshire is place second highest in the county, with Craven in third place. For the Anxiety measure Craven has the lowest levels nationally while Richmond is third and Ryedale fifth lowest.
