STREAM is moving to Data North Yorkshire

As we mentioned in our previous newsletter **STREAM** will be moving to become part of the Data North Yorkshire web site on 20 June. The new site is at www.datanorthyorkshire.org.



Data North Yorkshire already includes many of the most frequently used datasets from **STREAM** together with new sources of information and analysis based articles, with more to follow over the coming weeks. If any of the datasets that you need are not yet on the system please get in touch.

Data North Yorkshire is simple to use. A search box on the homepage allows the information to be found easily, either in Articles (interactive data dashboards with supporting text which provides an analysis of the data) or in Datasets (information which can be downloaded, usually as spreadsheets or PDFs).

To download information from a dataset just click on the 'Explore' button which appears to the right of the dataset name and choose 'Download'. Datasets which have a common theme such as Demographics or Economy can also be found together by following the Groups link on the homepage.

Population projections updated


The Office for National Statistics have released new population projections which show that the population of North Yorkshire population is expected to increase by 4.9%, reaching 631,100 by 2039.

The 2014-based projections indicate growth across all districts, with the exception of Richmondshire which is expected to see a -1.5% fall in population during the projection period. The growth is driven by migration from other parts of England, with the 65 and over population increasing while the younger age groups reduce in size.

New obesity slides from Public Health England



Two new graphical presentations which focus on child obesity and on adult obesity have been released by Public Health England.

The slides use infographics to highlight key data and information which identify patterns and trends in obesity levels. The slides aim to inform a wide range of services and initiatives.

Household projections and population estimates to be updated

Two of the most heavily used datasets on our system are due to be updated over the coming weeks.



District level population estimates for mid-2015 will be released by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) on 23 June. The release will include a breakdown by single years of age and by sex. They will be added to Data North Yorkshire at <http://hub.datanorthyorkshire.org/dataset/population>.

On 12 July the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) will release updated household projections, providing numbers of households through to 2039 at district level. We will be adding the updated figures to <http://hub.datanorthyorkshire.org/dataset/households>.

Could you help us to develop Data North Yorkshire?

Some of you will already have begun to use www.DataNorthYorkshire.org to access data and to find information about the county. The site is developing rapidly and we need your help to make it as useful and easy to use as possible.

Over the summer we will be holding a number of user engagement sessions to look at the type of information that people need, whether the site meets user requirements and how users access the information on the site.
