CONSTITUTION - PART 3 -RESPONSIBILITY FOR FUNCTIONS

(Last revised October 2014)

General Limitations – Council Functions

General limitations on the exercise of delegated powers by Committees Sub-Committees or officers acting under delegations from Council under s101 of the Local Government Act 1972 as amended, apply as follows:-

- (i) delegated powers must be exercised in conformity with this Constitution and with any other directions of the Council.
- (ii) the Urgency Committee has powers to act contrary to or not in conformity with the policy framework and outside the budget framework in the circumstances described at 2(b) below, but otherwise must act in accordance with this Constitution and any other directions of the Council.
- (iii) for the period between the local elections and the Annual Meeting of the Council provided they are still elected councillors, any consultations required under the arrangements in this Constitution with chairs, or in their absence vice-chairs, should be with those persons who were chairs and vice-chairs of committees or sub-committees at the time of the election:
- (iv) Committees and Sub-Committees may not arrange further general delegation of the powers granted to them by Council but they may delegate an individual decision or task to a Sub-Committee or Officer where this is expedient.

These general limitations apply to all persons and bodies exercising delegated powers in respect of Council functions set out in sections 1, 2 and 4 of this Part of the Constitution.

General Limitations – Executive Functions

Executive functions delegated under s15, 19 or 20 of the Local Government Act 2000 must be exercised in accordance with the Council's policy and budget framework subject to any discretions permitted by, and within any limitations imposed by, the Executive Procedure Rules.

These general limitations apply to persons and bodies exercising delegated powers in respect of executive functions set out in sections 1, 3 and 4 of this Part of the Constitution.
